This accessibility statement applies to Bryngwran Community Council web site at <http://www.bryngwran.org>

This website is operated by Bryngwran Community Council.

All content is provided by the Clerk on behalf of the community council

We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- The site displays correctly in current browsers and using standards compliant HTML/CSS code means any future browsers will also display it correctly.
- To increase or decrease the size of the text displayed on this website - hold the Ctrl key and the "+" or "-" (or scroll mouse wheel) to adjust the size

We have also made the website text as simple as possible to understand.

Whilst we try to adhere to the accepted guidelines and standards for accessibility and usability, it is not always possible to do so in all areas of the website

How accessible this website is

We know some parts of this website are not fully accessible:

- Some text on some pages may have a lower contrast than would be ideal.
- You cannot modify the line height or spacing of text
- Most older PDF documents are not fully accessible to screen reader software
- You cannot skip to the main content when using a screen reader

Technical information about this website’s accessibility

Bryngwan Community Council is committed to making its website accessible, in accordance with the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

Compliance status

This website is partially compliant with the [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.1](#) AA standard, due to issues with text contrast on some pages, no alternative text for some notices shown as JPG and PDFs used to display minutes as listed below.

Non-accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons.

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations

Some images do not have a text alternative, so people using a screen reader cannot access the information. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.1.1 (non-text content). We plan to add text alternatives for all images by December 2021. When we publish new content, we will make sure our use of images meets accessibility standards.

Some PDF links open in a new page. People using a screen reader may not notice the new tab opening. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.1.1 (non-text content). A warning will be placed on the minute's page by December 2021 to explain this behaviour.

Some notices on the web site have been posted as JPG images. This makes it difficult for people using a screen reader to access the information. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.4.9 (images of text). The existing images will be reviewed and removed if the notice is no longer required. We plan to added informational text to all JPG notices from now on.

The title of some PDFs may be difficult to read. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.1.1 (non-text content). These will be reviewed by December 2022 and we will ensure that future titles are clear.

Disproportionate burden

Navigation and accessing information

There is no way to skip the repeated content in the page header (for example, a 'skip to main content' option).

It is not always possible to change the device orientation from horizontal to vertical without making it more difficult to view the content.

It is not possible for users to change text size without some of the content overlapping.

Interactive tools and transactions

We have assessed the cost of fixing the issues with navigation and accessing information, and with interactive tools and transactions. We believe that doing so now would be a [disproportionate burden](#) within the meaning of the accessibility regulations. We will make another assessment when the supplier contract is up for renewal, likely to be in 2023.

Content that's not within the scope of the accessibility regulations

PDFs and other documents

Some of our PDFs and Word documents are essential to providing our services. For example, we have PDFs with information about Agenda and Minutes

The accessibility regulations [do not require us to fix PDFs or other documents published before 23 September 2018](#) if they are not essential to providing our services. For example, we do not plan to fix minutes published as PDF before this date.

Any new PDFs or Word documents we publish will meet accessibility standards.

What we're doing to improve accessibility

We will improve the way that minutes and agenda are published on our web site so people using a screen reader can access the information
